It is that time of year that exudes with optimism and closely kin to optimism, is THANKFUL-NESS. I especially want to extend to all a wonderful holiday season. I am truly thankful to the foresight of the Lions of Alabama who 77 years ago established Alabama Lions Sight. Lions have made a positive impact on so many in this great state! We are so dependent upon our sight in every aspect of our lives. Yet it can and often is taken for granted by many. As Lions, we are engaged with folks that are seeking help with vision impairments. The truth is that more than 80% of vision impairments are either curable or treatable if caught early. Lions are back to vision screenings! Over the past three months, ALS has had more than 1300 children eyes screened! It is so crucial to screen children's eyes early because a child doesn't realize he/she is having vision problems because there is no point of reference of seeing any different. Whatever the condition is, the child just thinks that is the way it is supposed to be.

While we are continuing our quest to screen in every public school, however, let me encourage you to not overlook the private sector in your communities. Private schools are usually open for Lions to come in and do vision screenings. Last week the Northport Lions did a vison screening in American

> Recently our Mobile Eye Clinic celebrated its 1000th site visit! Dr. Daum has seen more than 7000 patients and issued more than 5000 pairs of glasses! Lions are truly to be commended for the wonderful work that is being accomplished through the MEC. Vision care is being brought to the underserved and uninsured in many poor counties in Alabama that normally would have no access to care. Everyday lives are being changed for the better and many serious

health conditions are being caught and treated as well. The MEC is operating at capacity in covering 23 counties. We have a great need to add a second truck to help more people. The ALS Gala set for November 13th, at the 4 H Center in Columbiana, we are emphasizing the raising of funds for this second MEC. As I write this article, we are only days away from this event. 

Where could we improve?


Equipped with the answers to these questions, your club can build a team, build a vision for a better club, build a plan, and build success. Success is defined by your club. Resources can be

# Happy 100th Birthday INSULIN!

The use of insulin to treat Type 1 Diabetes happened 100 years ago! It is considered to be one of the greatest medical breakthroughs. Sir Frederick Banting, Charles Best, and John MacLeod injected insulin into the inaugural patient – Leonard Thompson, who was 14 years old. After this young man received his second shot of insulin his blood sugars dropped to normal levels, saving his life.

The American Diabetes Association was founded in 1936, with the mission of preventing, managing, and researching a cure. One of the current concerns of the American Diabetes Association is the cost of insulin for needy people with diabetes. To help solve this problem, they have set up a website – insulinhelp.

org for information on how to get insulin. Also, they have set up a helpline at 1-800-DIABETES (1-800-342-2383) to speak with a representative from the American Diabetes Association.

One of the core areas of service for Lions Club International is Diabetes. If any Lion knows of anyone struggling to afford insulin, please share the above resources from the American Diabetes Association. As Lions, we too, can play a role in preventing and managing and finding a cure. Hopefully, 100 years from now we will have defeated diabetes!

## Emergency Response Trailers Alabama Lions ready to serve before disaster hits

While October brings much anticipated cooler weather in Alabama, the Lions of Alabama received another cool and welcome event this past month. On October 16, 2021, all three Alabama Lions districts received possession of an ALERT Lions Trailer.

ALERT (Alabama Lions Emergency Response Team) Trailers are trailers filled with necessities needed in response to emergencies. They were first conceptualized for Alabama in 2007 by District C's PDG Bobby Ziglar and PDG Gus Pacheco. Several years later after flooding in District A, the idea was mentioned again.

Past Council Chair Floyd "Bubba" Bingham, as ALERT Chair, led the effort in 2020 to bring ALERT trailers to life. Under his leadership, ALERT received grant money from LCIF (Lions Club International Foundation) from a new grant program called "Disaster Preparedness." While PCC Bingham served as support lead, PID Lowell Bonds served as the project's logistics lead. PID Bonds spearheaded manufacturing, stocking, and delivery of the exciting new trailers.

When the District Governors met in Pelham, Alabama to receive their trailers, their smiles spoke volumes. "When tornadoes hit Fultondale last year, we had to

wait to assess the need, and make multiple trips to stores in various locations, which were out of stock due to demand," stated DG Brenda Elliot. "With pre-stocked emergency response trailers, we are ready to serve with items from underwear to tools, and mops."

DG Mechele Mosley, is most excited about serving the underserved rural areas in her district. "Some of our hardest hit areas in natural disasters in our district do not qualify for LCIF grants due to lower population. As each of these trailers represent \$10k in LCIF monies, we are already in position and ready. It's not if we have a natural disaster in our district, it's when," Mosley stated.

"Storing emergency supplies for disasters is the most efficient way to utilize disaster funds from LCIF" stated PID Bonds. "When there is an emergency, it is not always easy to assign every dollar by LCIF guidelines in a timely manner."

The stocked trailers will serve as disaster relief efficiency on wheels and epitomize the heart of Lions Club International's slogan, "We Serve." The trailers can also be reserved by clubs for publicity, such as parades, and recruitment events by reaching out to their
